Justine Menzel, Deputy City Manager presented the Artesia Strategic Plan Update.

A. COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES ANIMAL CARE AND CONTROL SERVICE AGREEMENT EXTENSION, ENFORCEMENT FEES AND DELINQUENCY CHARGES

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ARTESIA ADOPTING BY REFERENCE THE UPDATED AND AMENDED VERSION OF TITLE 10, ANIMALS, OF THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY CODE, AND AMENDING SECTION 6-1.01 OF CHAPTER 1 OF TITLE 6 OF THE ARTESIA MUNICIPAL CODE

Justine Menzel, Deputy City Manager presented staff report and introduced representatives from animal control.

Councilmember Flowers inquired about the time frame for picking up dead animals. She stated that she was told three days when she contacted animal control to pickup at dead dog at her father's home.

Mr. Rojas replied that dead animals are picked up within 24 hours.

Councilmember Flowers stated that she might have the name of the person who gave her that information.

Mr. Rojas stated that the information given by the clerk was totally wrong.

Councilmember Nelson requested response on a situation that occurred when animal control was called and he was told that they could not do anything about a pit bull dog running loose if the dog didn't bite anyone.

Mr. Rojas replied that was incorrect and that the clerk should had taken the address where the loose dog was located and then an officer would respond to the call trying to locate to see if they could find the loose dog or the people who had seen the dog.

Councilmember Nelson stated that three calls were made for this incident.

Maria Dadian, City Manager stated that she worked with the sheriff department regarding this incident. She said since the dog was placed in the house of residence animal control said that the dog was contained and they would take a report later since no one was bitten by the animal.

Mr. Rojas said that any incidents of a dog bite the officer would respond or impound the dog if it was a stray. He said the officer would do an investigative report and contact the health department and if a victim was bitten the animal would be quarantined.

Councilmember Nelson stated it would help if the public was informed of the necessary criteria required in order to give a good report on a complaint or request.

Mr. Rojas stated that it was the clerk's responsibility to ask the necessary questions.

Councilmember Nelson inquired if traps are provided by animal control.

Mr. Rojas stated that traps were provided in the past but the program didn't work out because traps were not returned and reimbursements were not received back. He said the shelter does have traps it just depends on availability.

Councilmember Nelson inquired if the animal control contract states that dead animals are picked up within 24 hours.

Ms. Duong replied by saying no.

Councilmember Nelson inquired as to what could be done to include in the contract the pickup of dead animals within 24 hours.

Maria Dadian, City Manager replied she would need to present the requests to animal control to see if they would include it in the contract.

Councilmember Nelson inquired if there were any other issues that needed to be presented to animal control.

Maria Dadian, City Manager stated that the collecting of administrative fees for acceptance of licenses could be included in the request.

Kevin Ennis, City Attorney inquired if the standard field level service included that animals would be picked up within 24 hours.

Mr. Rojas stated that he didn't know if that was included in standard field level service.

Ms. Duong stated that services levels depend on the staffing availability and the urgency of call.

Mr. Rojas stated depending on the time of day as to how many employees are available and the dead animal might not be picked up until the next day.

Mayor Lima inquired if a dead animal was priority.

Mr. Rojas replied that it depended on the location of the dead animal and where the driver was coming from.

City Attorney Ennis requested clarification if the standard level service statement was referring to the answering of calls and/or picking up of dead animals.

Mr. Rojas stated that calls are received 24 hours a day. He said there is always a dispatcher and field officer available.

City Attorney Ennis suggested working the language and clarification of the pickup of dead animals within the 24 hours.

Mayor Pro Tem Manalo stated that there was no detail listed in the standard service plan.

City Manager Dadian stated that Title 10 could possibly address those certain issues. She requested continuance of this item to address the questions raised.

Council member Nelson inquired after the discussion takes place with animal control would that information be brought back to the City Council.

Mayor Lima inquired if the administrative fees information would be brought back to the City Council at the same time.

Councilmember Lyon commented that the receptionist at animal control isn't understanding the policies. He said that there was a opossum loose in the neighborhood so he contacted animal control to obtain a trap and he was told they do not provide traps. He then inquired if he obtained a trap and trapped the animal would they pick it up. He said he was told "no" and suggested he trap it and let it go a few blocks away.

Mr. Rojas stated that they stopped trapping wild life.

Councilmember Lyon verified if he caught the opossum then animal control would not take it away.

Mr. Rojas replied by saying no they would not take the animal away.

Mr. Harvey replied they were not required to be replaced but he thought they were doing some planting but he would find out for sure.
