Mental Health Assistance



Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health (DMH)

DMH provides mental health services for unhoused individuals experiencing mental health crisis through its HOME (Homeless Outreach & Mobile Engagement) program. HOME serves individuals 18 and over who are experiencing chronic unsheltered homelessness, and who have profound mental health needs and associated impairments. Most referrals are submitted by the homeless outreach providers who identify individuals with severe impairment that require specialized and intensive support and engagement. The general public may initiate a referral to a homeless outreach team through the **Los Angeles Homeless Outreach Portal** (LA-HOP) at www.LA-HOP.org. Individuals will be triaged to a HOME team if the person meets the criteria.
