The City of Artesia developed the Scholarship Program to provide financial assistance and support the academic efforts of high school seniors residing in Artesia. The program provides scholarship opportunities to students who are pursuing a college education or seeking to develop expertise in a trade or vocation. The City holds the Scholarship Program with the support of community members, businesses, civic groups, and churches, to award scholarships annually. The City appreciates the opportunity to partner with community sponsors to make the Scholarship Program possible.

Scholarships

Individual scholarships will range from \$500 to \$1,000, with additional scholarships potentially available depending on sponsorship contributions

Scholarship Criteria

Eligibility: Applicants must be current high school seniors residing in the City of Artesia.

Academic Requirements: Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher and plan to attend a community college, university, or vocational/trade school in the fall of 2026.

Complete Application Packet: A complete application must include the following:

- A fully filled-out scholarship application form.
- An original 2-page essay.
- Proof of residency within the City of Artesia (e.g., utility bill, lease agreement).
- A copy of a valid school ID.
- An official school transcript.

Award Presentation: Scholarship recipients must attend a City Council meeting to receive their award.

Proof of Enrollment: To receive the scholarship funds, the winner must provide a college acceptance letter or proof of enrollment in a trade/vocational school.

Disbursement of Funds: Scholarship funds will be sent directly to the institution where the recipient is enrolled for the fall term.

Applicants are encouraged to carefully review their submission for grammatical errors and typos prior to submitting it to the City of Artesia. While tools such as ChatGPT or similar programs may be used for general guidance or editing support, essays should reflect the applicant's original thoughts and voice. Submissions that appear to be primarily generated by artificial intelligence may result in point deduction, even if the essay is otherwise well written.
